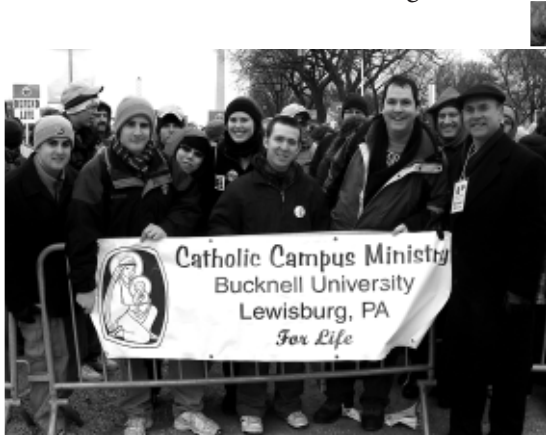
Alex Muchow '11
